



TITLE I Complaint/Procedure





Lincoln qualifies for Title 1 funds because over 40% of our students are enrolled in the Free and Reduced Lunch program. Lincoln provides free breakfast and lunch.

How does Lincoln qualify for Federal Funding from TITLE I?

\$100 per student).

How are TITLE I Funds used?

- Improve curriculum
- Improve instructional activities
- Increase parental involvement
- Professional development

All to raise academic achievement. Title 1 funds help provide additional assistance to at risk students - typically students that are academically low.

TITLE I Parent Involvement Policy

A requirement of TITLE I schools

- States that parents are encouraged to be an active participant at their child's school
- Reviewed/revised annually, with input from parents and staff
- Includes a list of volunteer opportunities
- Offers various times/days/nights to be involved in parent workshops

TITLE I Home School Compact A requirement of TITLE I schools

- e It is a written agreement signed by parents, students, and staff expressing their shared responsibilities for improved academic achievement.
 - You have the right to be involved in the development of said compact.
- It will be sent home with our students and be posted on our

Parent's Right to Know Student Achievement Whenever students take any state assessments, those results will be shared





Is my child's teacher a highly qualified teacher?

- Schools are required to notify parents if their child has been taught for
 4 or more consecutive weeks by a teacher that is not highly qualified
- You, as a TITLE I parent, have the right to ask about their child's teacher professional qualifications.

Have a complaint in regards to TITLE I?

- You have the right to bring that complaint to our attention.
- Know that our principal and assistant principal may not be available right away, but they will get back to you after investing the complaint.





- Limited History Background Check.
 - Required to volunteer during the school day.
 - Free to fill out.
 - Good for 3 years.

TITLE I Parent Resource Room

- The Parent Resource Room stores donated uniforms, snow boots, winter jackets, school supplies, pant belts, and backpacks.

- We also try to connect with parents in advance for parental permission to send supplies home, such as a jacket or backpack.

 Felicia, Ms. Karla Gonzalez Munoz (Bilingual Services Specialist), or myself to fill out a Christ Child Referral. Christ Child Society hands out a winter jacket, shoes, underclothing, uniforms and regular clothing to students 12 yrs. and younger in families that qualify financially.


PTO
